Good morning,

I have a few thoughts.

On paper, I agree with you. It could be laid out in a way that is both more intuitive and user friendly.

I agree with Dan that, with no complaints, it's an unnecessary project in the short term.

I think many of our archival systems could be improved and we should be regularly reviewing them to do so.

Web design is a relatively small part of Dan's job and gets in the way of other work. However, he gets lots of requests to make the page more functional or to highlight important or upcoming events and issues. This is the main reason Raverty proposed a comms coordinator position. Among other duties, that dedicated staff would manage the website. I can't say I am fully convinced of the merits of such a position, but Nick has been finding many of the same issues and frustrations as you.

Agendas, minutes, and other records are the Clerk's duties. As part of her interview, Camilla said she wanted to improve the website to increase user functionality for all of the clerks services. She has a degree in communications and is one of our most tech-competent staff. I think we could just give her access to the website and you, I, and the CIT committee could work with her in efficiencies.

Lastly, I should say the current layout works well for me. I frequently require access to old agendas and minutes. But I think the typical user requires access to the next council agenda and very, very few citizens will be looking for more than that.

Good thoughts. If you don't mind, let's get Camilla settled and come back to this in a few weeks.

I don't know, it seems to me I'd rather have it laid out thoughtfully before complaints happen. Maybe I'm making a big deal out of nothing? It just isn't super user friendly.
