1		JIM PAINE, CITY OF SUPERIOR WITNESS, DULY SWORN
2		DIRECT EXAMINATION
3	BY	ATTORNEY PRELL:
4	Q	Good morning, Mayor Paine. How are you employed,
5		please?
6	A	I am the full-time mayor of Superior, Wisconsin.
7	Q	And how long have you been mayor for the City of
8		Superior?
9	A	About seven and a half years. I was elected in
10		April of 2017.
11	Q	And you've been mayor for the City throughout
12		your entire involvement with the proceeding that
13		is playing out in front of Judge Newmark right
14		now?
15	A	Yes.
16	Q	And obviously you recall drafting some days ago
17		for filing with this Commission Surrebuttal
18		testimony on behalf of the City of Superior?
19	A	Yes.
20	Q	And I'm guessing you recollect making reference
21		to and physically attaching through your Rebuttal
22		testimony a two-page-and-some-change document
23		entitled Wisconsin Water Utility Rates?
24	A	Yes.
25	Q	Would you explain for the Commission, please, how

1		you view the relevance of that exhibit and why it
2		is that you chose that exhibit to attach to your
3		Surrebuttal testimony?
4	A	Yes, because the rate increase affects the
5		would affect the water utility in Superior,
6		Wisconsin; and because at least part of the
7		conversation raised in some of the other
8		testimony referred to comparing Superior Water,
9		Light and Power to other utilities, many
10		different types of utilities, I felt it was
11		important that, if they were going to be compared
12		to other utilities, it should be placed in
13		context relating to the water utility, it
14		should be placed in context to how much other
15		utilities in Wisconsin are charging our citizens.
16		I believe obviously all Wisconsin
17		citizens should be treated equally, but I don't
18		believe in fact, I know that they are not
19		assessed the same rates for water. Every utility
20		assesses a different rate. And in Superior, we
21		are charged the highest water rates for
22		individual water usage for water users, and so I
23		wanted to provide some evidence that documented
24		that.
25	O	And with regard to the exhibit, the information

1		contained within the exhibit itself, the rate
2		chart itself, I assume that was information you
3		gleaned from public databases?
4	A	Yes. The PSC actually offers a fairly user
5		friendly tool that allows you to produce data of
6		all kinds about utilities in Wisconsin. So it's
7		fairly easy to use the PSC's own website to
8		create this data.
9	Q	And can you further swear that you made no
10		efforts to manipulate the data that you were able
11		to access from the Commission as you put this
12		exhibit together?
13	A	Yes. I can swear that this is just generated by
14		the tool.
15	Q	Thank you, Mayor.
16		ATTORNEY PRELL: Your Honor, the City
17		would offer the Paine exhibit as an attachment to
18		the Mayor's Surrebuttal submitted last week.
19		EXAMINER NEWMARK: All right. Perfect.
20		EXAMINATION
21	B	Y EXAMINER NEWMARK:
22	Q	So let me just ask to button this up, Mayor
23		Paine, Witness Paine, so you filed the
24		Surrebuttal and the exhibit, Paine-1. And are
25		those filings complete and correct to the best of

your knowledge? 1 Yes, Your Honor. 2 I just had a clarifying question. 3 O There are a number of utilities 4 5 highlighted in Exhibit-Paine-1 with, like, a 6 yellow highlight. Just curious what was being 7 communicated -- I'm assuming you put in those highlights; is that right? 8 I did not, Your Honor. Α 10 Okay. Q This was generated by one of our City Councilors 11 for a number of uses only about, I think, a month 12 or a month and a half ago; and we've been 13 researching water utilities for a number of 14 reasons, and so the highlighted sections have 15 16 relevance for a different issue. 17 Okay. That probably just says what I needed it 18 to say. 19 Full disclosure, Your Honor, it was just easier 20 to use this document rather than run it again. I 21 have this document on my computer. So now we understand. 22 Q 23 So the highlights on this exhibit 24 just have no connection to this case?

1		EXAMINER NEWMARK: All right. So we
2		have the witness there. Let's have any
3		opportunity for Cross-Examination. We'll start
4		with the Applicant on that.
5		ATTORNEY MOELLER: A couple questions,
6		Your Honor.
7		CROSS-EXAMINATION
8	BY	ATTORNEY MOELLER:
9	Q	Mayor Paine, you said that somebody else created
10		this document, but you had just said on the
11		record that you created this document.
12		I just wanted to clarify who
13		created this document.
14	A	I apologize if I said that I created it. I
15		submitted it.
16		This was created by Councilor
17		Jenny Van Sickle but, again, using the PSC's
18		tool. I could create it. I have since
19		learned to create it, but this specific
20		document was run by her. I then so I could
21		create it today. I did not create this specific
22		document.
23	Q	Thank you. And does this document include other
24		footnotes or other things that are on the PSC's
25		website?

1	A	No, not that I'm aware of.
2	Q	Let me rephrase. I'm sorry.
3		Has the document been modified
4		from anything that was taken from the PSC's
5		website?
6	A	Beyond the highlights, no, not that I'm aware.
7	Q	And maybe one final question.
8		Do the water rates to your
9		knowledge, do the water rates incorporate
10		everything that is paid for for water usage in
11		various municipalities and Superior Water, Light
12		and Power?
13	A	Do you mind elaborating on that a little bit?
14		I'm sorry.
15	Q	Yeah, sure.
16		Do the water rates incorporate
17		other things that pay for water in various
18		municipalities across the state of Wisconsin?
19		For example, if taxes pay for certain aspects of
20		water rates, does the document incorporate those
21		rates or those costs and expenses?
22	A	I guess I don't know the answer to that.
23		I don't know the specifics of
24		every municipality's water rate and certainly
25		admit that there are going to be many unique

1		features to every single utility. But I don't
2		know how these other rates are constructed. I
3		know what people are paying.
4	Q	So is it fair to say that it's not always a
5		direct comparison on apples to apples with every
6		single municipality and Superior Water, Light and
7		Power?
8	A	I'm arguing that it's fair to say that it's
9		dollar for dollar.
10		ATTORNEY MOELLER: No further
11		questions, Your Honor.
12		EXAMINER NEWMARK: Okay. Thanks.
13		How about other Intervenors? And
14		Commission Staff?
15		ATTORNEY BEDFORD: No questions from
16		Commission Staff, Your Honor.
17		EXAMINER NEWMARK: All right. That's
18		fine. So we have that on the record, and we can
19		excuse this witness. Thanks very much oh,
20		actually, let me ask, is there any Redirect
21		questions?
22		ATTORNEY PRELL: No, Your Honor. Thank
23		you.

25		that's fine. Then you're excused. Thanks.
